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PART I: GRANT INTRODUCTION

The Phi Sigma Sigma Foundation is seeking to provide grants to charitable organizations that implement innovative programs and projects that support our philanthropic cause—school and college readiness.

Our Philanthropic Cause

The selection of school and college/university readiness as Phi Sigma Sigma’s philanthropic cause was determined with membership input via surveys, focus groups and interviews. Phi Sigma Sigma members expressed a desire for more opportunities to volunteer locally and to make a significant difference in the lives of others.

These facts propelled our decision to focus on school and college/university readiness:

- 1 in 5 Canadian children live in poverty
- In the past 25 years, the number of low income kids in Canada increased from 912,000 to 967,000
- A student’s level of academic achievement by the eighth grade actually has a larger impact on his or her college or university readiness than anything that happens during high school
- 22% of working-age Canadians have not graduated from high school
- 27% university attainment (percentage of the population aged 25–64 with a university degree in Canada)

Since January 2015, Phi Sigma Sigma has been in partnership with the Kids in Need Foundation. This has allowed Phi Sigma Sigma to move forward with our philanthropic cause, school and college Readiness. As this organization does not provide extensive opportunities for our Canadian chapters to participate in philanthropic projects, the Phi Sigma Sigma Foundation is offering the School and College Readiness Canada Grant. Canadian charitable organizations which address School and University Readiness in Windsor or Ottawa, Ontario areas, may apply for a Phi Sigma Sigma Foundation School and College Readiness Canada Grant. No more than one grant per community will be awarded in the amount of \$500 to \$1,000 USD.

Eligibility Criteria of Organization

1. A Registered Canadian Charity
2. A non-religious organization (exceptions will be made for religious organizations that work to serve the entire community regardless of religious affiliation)
3. An organization with operating expenses that pertain directly to the work of the charity
4. An organization that has a primary focus of school and college/university readiness

Our Selection Process

The Foundation will review applications from a recommended charitable organization for the School and College Readiness Canada Grant. The charitable organization shall submit the application only once all elements of the application are complete.
